Black River Falls Municipal Utilities urges electric customers concerned about being able to pay their bill to apply for Energy Assistance before the May 15, 2020 deadline. Funding is available to help incomequalified residential customers pay their electric bills, including those whose employment has been impacted by the COVID-19 public health emergency.

"By sharing this information, we hope to alleviate some of the financial stress in the community. In Wisconsin, energy assistance eligibility requirements were adjusted to more efficiently assist families impacted by COVID-19 and are now based on the household's previous month of income, rather than the former requirement of the previous three-month's income. Energy Assistance provides bill pay support for heating costs, electric costs, and energy crises.

The recently passed CARES Act includes options that may be beneficial to small businesses and private non-profits to help overcome the temporary loss of revenue.
